Terminal Clean Request

Important to Note:

- 1. Do NOT disconnect any equipment
- 2. Do NOT move any uncleaned equipment into clean rooms
- 3. Keep all equipment inside rooms while cleaning
- 4. Keep doors CLOSED while cleaning
- 5. PPE needs to be removed while still inside the room after Terminal Clean

Procedure:

Put on appropriate apparel, such as impervious gown, goggles, shoe covers, and gloves. Crew MUST wear goggles and gloves always.

*Bee Line staff is NOT to clean any rooms where bed bugs or any other insects were seen unless client confirms it has been inspected and cleared by pest control.

Terminal cleaning of rooms and bathrooms

- 1. Prepare quaternary ammonia germicidal detergent solutions
 - a. Level 2 Terminal Clean requires beach clean
 - 1. Utilize healthcare-based bleach wipes that contain 1:10 bleach solution
 - 2. Prepare 1:10 bleach solution (discard after 24 hours)
- 2. Remove all trash and seal in large liner
- 3. Working from top to bottom and back to front of room
- 4. Wet wipe top of any cabinets, window ledges, pictures, etc.
- 5. Clean and disinfect high touch surface areas
 - a. Exam table
 - 1. Exam table drawers and handles
 - 2. Leg stirrups
 - 3. Area under exam table bed where paper cover is stored
 - b. Door knobs and handles
 - c. Light switches
 - d. Wall railings
 - e. Hand sanitizer and soap dispensers
 - f. Chairs
 - g. Sink faucets and handles
 - h. Grab bars
- 6. Spot clean walls
- 7. Clean toilets
- 8. Pick up all debris from floors
- 9. Wet mop floor using germicidal detergent solution
- 10. At end of terminal clean discard detergent solution, disinfectant wipes (if used) and place microfiber cloths and mop heads in soiled laundry container for pick up by laundry service
